At TriCity Family Services, we know that nurturing the emotional wellness of people leads to a more vibrant community—because when kids, teens, adults, and seniors are mentally healthy they can more freely participate in society, make more meaningful connections, advance their learning, and increase their creativity. Last year, we continued in our vision of strengthening the mental health of our local communities by joining 3,760 individuals in their mental health care journeys, holding 16,044 counseling sessions, and providing 40,376 total service hours right here in our Kane County neighborhoods.

While guiding more families toward success, we have also observed that individual cases are now requiring more direct attention, reflecting the depth and complexity of the mental health issues our clients are facing. It remains vital that our therapists provide personalized and comprehensive care to those in need.

A highlight of the past year was the remarkable growth of our Emotional Wellness program, which saw a significant increase in community outreach efforts. We have been able to reach more individuals, families, and organizations in our community, providing them with valuable resources and support to enhance their mental well-being.

As you may know, the mental health care sector is currently facing a national hiring crisis, with a shortage of qualified providers. Despite these challenges, we have made concerted efforts in the recruitment and retention of our staff. We have implemented strategies to attract experienced mental health professionals and prioritize the care of our current staff.

Looking ahead, TriCity Family Services aims to remain dedicated to our mission of providing quality, evidence-based mental health services that are accessible and affordable to all. We are actively exploring partnerships, collaborations, and funding opportunities to expand our services and reach even more individuals who need our support.

None of our achievements would be possible without the unwavering support of our donors, volunteers, staff, and community partners. We express our heartfelt gratitude to each and every individual and organization that has contributed to our cause, making it possible for us to make a positive impact on the lives of those affected by mental health challenges.






